# Evening With Books—MS Author Hezekiah Watkins



We're pleased to welcome MS author Hezekiah Watkins as the speaker for our Evening With Books program on May 18th at the

Robinson-Carpenter Memorial Library in Cleveland at 6 p.m.

Mr. Watkins, a Jackson native, will talk about his book Pushing Forward: The Story of Mississippi's Youngest Freedom Rider. Mr. Watkins was thirteen-years-old when the first group of Freedom

Riders arrived in Jackson on July 7, 1961. Wanting to learn what the group was about, he went to the Greyhound Bus Station in Jackson when they arrived, where he was mistaken for being a member of the group and arrested. His book chronicles the harrowing five days he spent at Parchman on Death Row and his subsequent work as a Civil Rights leader.

Those wishing to have Mr. Watkins sign copies of his book following the program may pre-order books from the Cotton

Row Bookstore before May 11th. These pre-ordered books may be picked up by May 17th or at the program itself on May 18th. Alternately, books will also be available for purchase at the program, but the number of copies may be limited.

We hope you will join us for this Evening With Books program featuring Hezekiah Watkins on May 18th at 6 p.m. The program is open to the public and is free-ofcharge. Light refreshments will be served.

BCLS is pleased to announce the acquisition of a MakerSpace and a variety of STEM Kits (hereafter collectively referred to as "MakerSpace") at the Robinson-Carpenter Memorial Library (RCML) in Cleveland.

The MakerSpace program is designed for children ages 3-12 and provides tools for children to explore, build, make things, and creatively learn through play, which is true of STEM Kits, as well. The main difference between the MakerSpace and STEM Kits is

the STEM Kits are more focused on science, technology, engineering, and mathematics and have a more structured learning process.

A MakerSpace program is offered the second Wednesday each month at RCML. Additionally, to ensure that the maximum benefit is gained from these wonderful learning systems, when the MakerSpace is not in use during programs, it will be available for an in-library use only checkout in the Children's Room. Please note that only a parent or legal guardian

may check-out the MakerSpace, must sign a MakerSpace Use and

Release form at the time of check-out, and must remain with the child during the check-out period.

## Looking for a Good Book?

Martha: Forget What You Know by Christina Dodd. A sequel to 2022 Point Last Seen, Forget What You Know revisits Gothic, California with characters you'll recognize, but it is a standalone. When the Dragon's Heart (a priceless ruby) surfaces in Gothic, collector's descend on the town. Then, Zoey Phoenix finds herself hospitalized by a car accident that doesn't seem so accidental. Zoey, who doesn't remember her childhood. finds herself a target, but why? As disappearances and murders begin happening, Zoey realizes she must unravel both her mysterious past and the truth about the mystical Dragon's Heart. More twists and turns that will leave you guessing until the very end. As usual, a very entertaining book with quirky characters! (Fiction—Print)

Samantha: Daisy Jones & The Six by Taylor Jenkins Reid. The book was really about an interview with a rock n' roll band that started out with doing gigs to get by until they meet with a producer. At that point, they started making albums and stared getting hit numbers on every album they made. This is the novel the mini-series of the same name on Amazon Prime streaming network is based. Good book! (Fiction—Print & eBook)

Tamara: The Sixth Extinction: An Unnatural History by Elizabeth Kolbert. This unsettling book relates the history of the previous five extinction events (like the asteroid impact that resulted in the extinction of dinosaurs) experienced by Earth while predicting another major extinction event caused by humans—in the not so distant future. Kolbert backs this prediction up with plenty of data to support her thesis. Excellent book! A Pulitzer Prize Winner, a New York Times Book Review's 10 Best Books of the Year, a New York Times Bestseller, and A National Book

Critics Circle Award Finalist. (Non -Fiction—Print)

Tamara: The Southern Book Club's Guide to Slaying Vampires by Grady Hendrix. Patricia Campbell is a happily, but boringly, married mother of two living in a nice, upper-middle class neighborhood in Charleston. Patricia appreciates her privileged life, but sometimes wishes "something" would happen. Then she finds friendship in a local book club from her neighborhood. The arrival of an attractive bachelor James into the neighborhood has everyone wondering about his strange habits. When people start disappearing and dying, Patricia begins to suspect that lames is not who he says he is... A fresh take on the traditional vampire novel that is funny, devastating, heartwarming, and horrifying in turns. Recommended for everyone who loves a good thriller. (Fiction—Print)

## Some Bolivar County History...

### "Rosedale by Florence Sillers Ogden"

The last excerpt left off at the end of the paragraph ending: "Among them were the Sillers, Christmas, and W. A. Shelby families. The next and final quarantine for yellow fever was in 1905."

"Below is a list of the Rosedale officials from 1900 to 1945:

1900: R. J. Matthews, mayor; G. P. Rice, C. L. Jones, George L. Kerg, aldermen; O. D. Thomas, clerk. 1904: W. H. Fitzgerald, mayor; John V. Lobdell, W. Mac Anderson, R. H. Purnell, C. L. Jones, aldermen; O. D. Thomas, clerk.

1906: W. A. Stone, mayor; the board of 1904 was re-elected; Doctors Sutherland and Sandifer, health officers.

1908: W. A. Stone, mayor; H. C. Goldman, J. A. Eddins, R. H. Purnell, W. A. Shelby, aldermen; O. D. Thomas, clerk.

1910: John V. Lobdell, mayor; W. H. Fitzgerald, E. H. Woods, Walter Sillers, J. L. Wilson, aldermen; S. A. Hinds, clerk; W. F. Poole, acting marshal.

1912: Marcus L. Kaufman, mayor; W. H. Fitzgerald, W. A. Shelby, J. A. Eddins, J. L. Wilson, aldermen; Marcus L. Kaufman, clerk.

1914: W. H. Fitzgerald, mayor, J. L. Wilson, W. A. Shelby, P. H. Joest, J. A. Eddins, aldermen; Mrs. Minnie Littleton, clerk.

1916: W. H. Fitzgerald, mayor; J. L. Wilson, Bonner Richardson, P. H. Joest, E. R. Chaney, aldermen; Walter Sillers, Jr., attorney; R. A. Linnel, marshal; Minnie E. Littleton, clerk. In the year 1916 there was a heated campaign between W. H. Fitzgerald and J. L. Wilson for mayor. A short time before the election Mr. Fitzgerald died and Mr. Fontaine Jones took his place in the race. Mr. Wilson was elected and has held the office up to the present time, except for a short time interim when his son, J. L. Wilson, Jr., served."
