
Christmas is almost here and so is the Annual Grape Expectations Benefit


Local chefs and the Friends are planning the wonderful hors d'oeuvres for Gala guests to enjoy while listening to live entertainment the Friends have

Author Charlie Spillers—Guest Speaker at Luncheon With Books



Mr. Spiller's exciting book is available for check-out at Robinson-Carpenter or you can complete a request card at any branch if you want to check it out at another location.




Santa Visits the Story Hour and Teens Help With Decorations

Some Bolivar County History...

"WAR: As Affecting Bolivar County and its Citizens, 1861-1862 By Walter Sillers

South Carolina seceded, Mississippi followed, and feverish preparations for war began in every part of the country.

The Bolivar Troop, a superb cavalry company, was organized at Prentiss, the county site. Colonel Charles Clark, a Mexican War veteran, was elected captain, but shortly afterwards was appointed a general in the Confederate Army, and Frank Montgomery was elected captain in his stead.

W. N. Brown organized and Miles McGehee equipped an infantry company from the northern part of the county, named the "McGehee Rifles." Brown was made captain.

Dr. R. M. Mason organized the Mason Dragoons, of which he was captain. Later, W. E. Montgomery organized a cavalry company of old men, wounded soldiers, and youngsters, known as the "Cameron Company State Troops, of which he was elected captain, Daniel Cameron, 1st lieutenant, and Joseph Sillers, 2nd lieutenant.

The Bolivar troop was drilled on the plantation of Captain F. A. Montgomery near the school-house where I was attending school at the time. When troopers began to drill, every school boy was equipped with a uniform and a little sword, and a juvenile cavalry company organized with Phillip Lee as captain, James Sillers, Ist lieutenant, and William Gayden, 2nd lieutenant. These boys, burning with the spirit of war and being fine horsemen, lost nothing in comparison with the trooper's mounts."
