Looking for a Good Book?

Tamara: Death on the Nile by Agatha Christie. This is the fifth Hercule Poirot mystery in the series and one of my favorites. Even if you've seen the movies (either the 1978 version with Peter Ustinov in the title role, or the 2022 movie with Kenneth Branagh as Poirot—both are excellent), the book is a fun and twisty read. The story of the jealous, jilted lover out for revenge against her former boyfriend and his new wife (and her former best friend!) set against the backdrop of the Nile River is a classic. Recommended for anyone who loves classic mysteries. (Fiction—Print)

Tamara: 'Salem's Lot by Stephen King. I read this in the 1970s not long after it was first published (1975) (and saw the movie that featured David Soul in 1979), but I've been longing to revisit the book for some time. The story opens with Ben Mears moving to Jerusalem's Lot, Maine, looking for a fresh start. 'Salem's Lot, as the locals call it, was the site of evil in the past—and, unfortunately for Ben, evil has just returned. In Stephen King's hands, this is so much more than just a horror novel about vampires. King was awarded the 2007 Grand Master Award from the Mystery Writers of America for a reason! Now I need to watch the 2024 movie to compare to the 1979 version... (Fiction—Print)

"Rosedale by Florence Sillers Ogden" - Continued

The last excerpt from Rosedale's history was the section "Lighting System."

"Water System

By order of the town, hitching racks were built around the courthouse square, and a water trough for the stock in front, where water was pumped by hand. This is the first record of a public water system. Homes were supplied through privately owned underground cisterns or wooden tanks above ground. For bathing purposes water had to be borne in and up the stairs in large buckets, a laborious system, probably responsible for the Saturday night custom. In 1901 a legislative amendment to the charter of 1882 was passed for the purpose of issuing \$15,000 of bonds to establish "an artesian well or other water supply." It was October, 1902, before running water was available to the citizens. Rates for dwellings of more than four rooms were five dollars per quarter, plus five dollars per tub, five dollars per closet, and fifty cents per head for stock."
