

In 1968, Albert Lepard escaped from Parchman again—and kidnapping Mr. Boteler from his farm in Grenada. The author recounts his experiences and the other crimes Lepard committed during his six escapes from Parchman. "Mr. Boteler was a very entertaining guest," Librarian Martha Lawson notes. "When someone asked where he got the name Lovejoy, the author stated it was his grandmother's family name and said it caused him no amount of grief in his growing-up years! Everyone attending had a very enjoyable evening."

Martha: Nell and Lady by Ashley Farley. Story of Lady, the daughter of wealthy Charlestonian Willa Bellemore, and Nell, the daughter of Willa's maid Mavis, who were raised as sisters. When Mavis died suddenly, Willa went against convention (this was in the 70's) and legally adopted Nell. Nell and Lady had always been close as sisters, now it was official! But something happened at Lady's 16th party and Nell no longer speaks to Lady or Willa. Now years later, Willa is hospitalized and she calls for Nell, who reluctantly returns. What secrets will finally be revealed? A great book that will keep you

reading far into the night. This is not my first book by Miss Farley and it certainly won't be my last! Women's fiction at it's best. (Fiction—Print)

Tamara: Chocolate Cream Pie Murder: A Hannah Swensen Mystery with Recipes! by Joanne Fluke. Hannah is still struggling to understand husband Ross' betrayal, but is ready to put him behind her. The local film festival featuring local film makers provides the opportunity to highlight the cookie store, but Ross has been invited to appear—which he does, but in an unexpected way! Tamara: Paw Enforcement by Diane Kelly. First in the series of the same name, Paw Enforcement introduces police officer Megan Luz and K-9 police dog Brigit, who are reluctant partners tracking down a serial bomber.
