Martha Lawson has been the Branch librarian at Rosedale and Gunnison since October 31, 2007, and has the distinction of the second highest circulation in the library system.

Martha, who was born and raised in Gunnison, confides, "I have always been an avid reader and I love libraries. When this job became available, I immediately applied." Martha has had a long history with the Rosedale and Gunnison branches. "I had helped the librarian in Gunnison when I

was a teenager," Martha relates, "and I also worked in the library at Rosedale High School. After working at the library in Rosedale for about year, I was asked to also work at the library in Gunnison. I now work 3 days a week in Rosedale and 2 days a week in Gunnison."

Martha is dedicated to not only her branches, but also librarianship in general. She was competitively chosen to attend the Mississippi Library Commission's (MLC) Librarianship 101 program in 2009. MLC designed the program to immerse "participants in the principles and tools of public librarianship," thereby empowering participants to be the best librarians possible.

Martha's hard work was recognized more recently when she received the Mary Julia Anderson Award in 2015 that recognizes an outstanding paraprofessional for their librarian work

"I love working at the library," Martha notes, "helping people find books and just interacting with my patrons! This is my dream job!"

When the call to arms was sounded throughout the Southland, W. N. Brown issued a call for the young men to meet on June 16th, 1861, at Prentiss, then the county seat of Bolivar County, to organize a military company. On that date, the company was organized and was named the "McGehee Rifles" in honor of Colonel McGehee, then the owner of Sunnywild plantation. Colonel McGehee immediately sent to Memphis for goods and tailors to make each man a uniform, and in a few days each man had a summer uniform. Then Colonel McGehee ordered the very best of Confederate gray cloth and had a winter uniform made for each man.

Before we left for the front Miss Blanche McGehee, the daughter of Colonel McGehee, presented us with a very handsome company flag, and we pledged to her that this flag would never fall into the hands of the enemy; when we were forced to surrender at the fall of Fort Donelson, at Dover, Tennessee, we built a fire and laid the flag in the flames, and so we kept our pledge.

On the company's leaving for the front, Colonel McGehee presented them with one thousand dollars to be used for the benefit of the sick. He also gave the company two fine mules and a wagon so that we would have transportation for our baggage if the quartermaster's department should happen to be short of wagons.

I write this so that the people may know that Colonel Miles McGehee did everything he could to help the South."
