### **NEA Big Reads Bolivar County**



As mentioned in the last newsletter, BCLS is partnering with Delta State University through a National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) grant in support of "NEA Big Read Bolivar County" program. The idea is for a community to read the same book and come together in celebration of the book through book discussions and other programs that explore the themes of the book.

The book chosen is an Oprah's Best Books of the Year and PEN/ Hemingway award winner

Homegoing by Yaa Gyasi. All Bolivar County Residents are invited to sign-up to receive a free paperback copy of the book and a free t-shirt!

The kick-off program is Friday, December 2nd in the first floor Union lobby at DSU or at Robinson-Carpenter Memorial Library (Cleveland) from 10 a.m. - 5 p.m. Everyone who has signed up or signs up that day can pick up a book. T-shirts will be available in January and everyone will be notified of where to pick it up at the email they provided during registration.

BCLS will be hosting a book discussion program on February 21st at 6 p.m. and a genealogy program on February 24th. Watch for flyers and our Facebook page for information about these programs and more coming in January -February 2023.

#### The Palace Project—eBooks & eAudios

The Palace Project is a state-wide eBook/eAudiobook lending program that is hosted by the Mississippi Library Commission and provided free-of-charge to all Mississippi residents.

You do not use your BCLS library card (or even have to have one) to use the service. Currently, the app works with newer Android or Apple mobile devices (unfortunately, it doesn't work with Kindle, Kobo, etc.) and you must download The Palace Project app from your app store to utilize the service. Then go to our website and navigate to the eBooks & eAudios (on the Homepage) and follow the instructions to create a "virtual library card." Be sure you choose "Mississippi Library Commission" for the library. You will also have to submit your address to show you are a MS resident—if prompted you must allow the app to access your location. If you have any questions or problems using the app, call us at 662-843-2774 or just bring your device in to the Robinson-Carpenter Memorial Library in Cleveland for assistance.

#### Looking for a Good Book?

Martha: Something in the Heir by Suzanne Enoch. Eight years ago, when Emmeline's grandfather said she could stay in the home she grew up in but stipulated that she had to have children, she married William. When she realized she was unable to have children, Emmeline "invented" them. All was well until her grandfather wanted her to bring the children to his 70th birthday party so he could meet them!! So, they decided to go to an orphanage and "borrow" a boy and girl to pretend they were their children (this was the 1800s in England). At home, the street-wise kids, ages 8 and 5, were being taught manners, while they were also stealing from their new "parents" items that they could sell to insure they wouldn't have to go back to the orphanage! Hilarity ensues as everyone in the household falls in love with them. This is a heartwarming story that is full of laughs.

I really enjoyed this feel good read! (Fiction—Print)

Tamara: Two Parts Sugar, One Part Murder by Valerie Burns. The first in the Baker Street Mystery series, this cozy mystery is so much fun. When spoiled bride Maddie is left at the alter, she thinks her life is over. So when she inherits her aunt's estate, she decides to pack her Louboutins, leave L.A., and travel to Michigan to see what she has inherited. As it turns out, she inherited a beautiful house, a thriving bakery, and Aunt Octavia's dog. But there's a another catch... She must live in Michigan in the house while running the bakery and caring for the dog-for a year! As you can probably guess, things don't go exactly as Maddie planned—especially after she finds a corpse in her new business. Did I mention she can't bake and has never owned a dog before? If you

love a good cozy mystery with a lot of humor, you'll love this. (Fiction—Print)

**Tamara:** It Came from the Closet: Queer Reflections on Horror edited by Joe Vallese with illustrations by Bishakh Som. A collection of essays by LGBTQIA+ authors who talk about the horror films that they most identify with as viewed from their perspective. I have a love of horror-both books and older films (especially 50s B movies and the Hammer Studio films) and was interested in how others would view these and other films. The resulting essays are deeply personal as the authors delve into their own experiences using mostly very well-known films as a springboard. I found the book to be illuminating—and their experiences often heartrending. I would recommend this for anyone who loves horror films and has an interest in the queer perspective. #### Some Bolivar County History...

#### "Rosedale by Florence Sillers Ogden"

The last excerpt left off at the end of the paragraph beginning: "In 1876, by an act of the legislature, [...]":

"There are no records from 1883 to 1890, but it was about time that Mr. Charles Scott began buying up property in and around Rosedale. His first purchase, according to the chancery records, were from J. H. Field and D. C. Herndon, in 1882, and were within the town. He continued to buy until he owned most of the property within the town. He sold building sites and donated a number of lots for church, school, and other purposes over a period of years.

In 1882, Mr. Scott purchased a small portion of the Rosedale plantation from Charles L. Jones, son of Colonel Lafayette Jones. In 1886 he added 590 acres and continued to buy until he owned what is still known as the Rosedale plantation, comprising 3,123 acres. In 1913, he built the "Manor", a handsome red brick house of antebellum design, in a beautiful pecan grove just north of the town. After Mr. Scott's death, in 1916, his wife moved away and their son, Alex Y. Scott, occupied the home.

In 1930 the Rosedale plantation and all town property passed out of the hands of the Scott family. Mrs. Fannie H. Ellis bought the "Manor" and surrounding grounds. The house was torn down and the grounds divided into lots and sold. Mrs. Ellis built a modern home from the materials in the old house, close to the same site. The subdivision has been taken into the corporate limits of the town of Rosedale. The plantation is owned by Alfred Welshans, Norwood Smith, Neal Streater, and others, at the present time."
