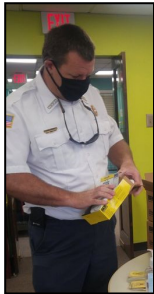

Director's Corner

COVID-19 has immeasurably impacted our everyday lives, and libraries are not exempt from those changes. We closed to the public on March 17, 2020 and reopened on June 22, 2020. I never would have imaged that I would face this type of challenge within my first year as your Library Director. Thankfully, our local governments and community leaders continued to support our efforts and our patrons have been understanding of the need to transition to a different type of library environment.

Obviously, the library of today is not the same as it was one year ago. We have limited patrons in the building and limited computers available. We impose a time limit on the computers to ensure everyone has access since so few are available. We require masks, social distancing and offer hand

sanitizer. We have suspended in-person programming and the Friends' backroom book sales. We must shut down to clean throughout the day. If you are like me and appreciate the liveliness, hustle-and-bustle, and friendships that were once commonplace in libraries, these changes can be a little sad.

I choose to focus on the positives. We are open and are here for you; many libraries are not open right now. All the changes we have made were implemented with patron and staff safety in mind. If you feel unsafe coming into the library, we are still offering curbside service. We will happily walk library materials out to you. You can sit in the parking lot and access our Wi-Fi. We also offer e-books, e-audio books and e-magazines if you would rather just stay in the safety of your

home. Our programming has transitioned to our Facebook page. Through a partnership with PBS, we offer a wide range of live programming for adults. Our smallest patrons have not been left out of the fun! Children's programming can also be located through our Facebook page and families can pick up take-away packets for the children/families to work on at home. One thing I am most pleased about is that with the new children's programming format we can reach children and families who otherwise would have been unable to attend our regular programs!

One day, this pandemic will be over. Until that time, we will continue to be diligent in ensuring your safety.

eBooks/eAudios/eMags

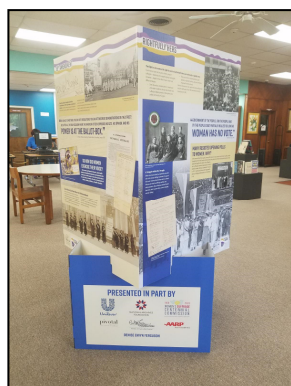

Rightfully Hers 19th Amendment Exhibit at Robinson-Carpenter

BCLS was pleased to be chosen as one of the organizations to receive the *Rightfully Hers* popup exhibits commemorating the 100th anniversary of the ratification of the 19th Amendment, women's voting rights before and after the 19th, and its impact today. The exhibit was on display at Robinson-Carpenter Memorial Library in Cleveland from August 17, 2020, through September 18, 2020.

The *Rightfully Hers* exhibit was co-curated by Jennifer N. Johnson at the National Archives, who stated, "The ratification of the 19th Amendment was a landmark moment in American history that dramatically changed the electorate, and although it enshrined in the U.S. Constitution fuller citizenship for women, many remained unable to vote."

The exhibit was organized by the National Archives and Records Administration, which launched this nationwide initiative and major exhibition that explores the generations-long fight for universal woman suffrage. The exhibit was presented in part by the Women's Suffrage Centennial Commission and the National Archives Foundation through the generous support of Unilever, Pivotal Ventures, Carl M. Freeman Foundation in honor of Virginia Allen Freeman, AARP, and Denise Gwyn Ferguson.

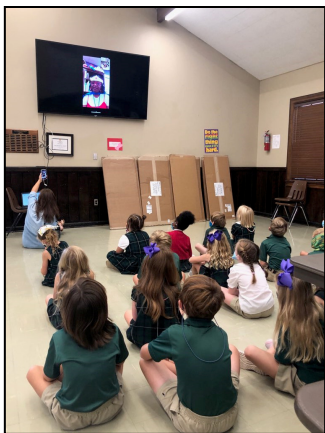

Children from the Presbyterian Day School enjoyed a virtual library visit and a story from Mrs. Bobbie on September 18, 2020.



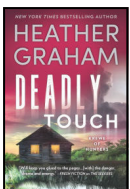
New Furniture in Shelby

Tamara: *The Pawful Truth* (A Cat in the Stacks Mystery) by Miranda James. When Charlie returns to

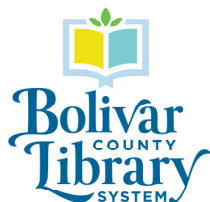
college he meets his professor, the charismatic Cary Warriner.

Some Bolivar County History. . .

"OTHER LETTERS

"Mississippi, Bolivar County,
February 20th, 1848

Dear Sister:

I take this opportunity of writing to you to inform you that we all are enjoying good health and prosperity and we hope these lines find you enjoying the same blessings. This is the second time that I have written you since I have received an answer, and I should have written several times between if it had not been so far to the Post Office.

When I wrote you last, we were living at Isaac Wilkerson's, we are now at home and are very happy and contented, and we expect to be able to come to see you once a year after this year. We have very kind, good neighbors, though not very enterprising. There is no prospects for the improvement of society. This is certainly a very fine country. I was in hopes that [brother] John would have come and settled in this country.

When you write to him, send him my love and tell him where we are and how we are doing. I must bring my letter to a close. Give my love to all the family.

Farewell, nothing more, but remain,
Yours affectionate Sister until death,

Susan R. Wilson"
